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HOW TO ADDRESS YOUTH VAPING AND TOBACCO USE?

A comprehensive tobacco-free campus policy that includes full implementation of all of the following:

- ✓ Evidence-based prevention education for all students.
- Access to and wide promotion of evidence-based cessation resources to help those wanting to quit.
- Consistent and frequent communication about the policy and related practices.
- Consistent and friendly enforcement with everyone. Instead of suspension, offer cessation access and require an evidence-based supportive discipline program for students.
- ✓ Engage students in policy adoption and implementation.

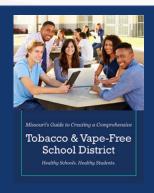
Implement Alternative to Suspension
