## Some of the highlights...

### REGULATED ENTITIES

14,510 inspections performed to ensure compliance of hospitals, long-term care facilities, hotels, prescribers, cannabis facilities and more.

### ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES & SPECIAL INVESTIGATIONS

- 34,280 reports of abuse, neglect, exploitation, and provider complaints taken by adult protective services staff.
- \$3,798,052.49 misappropriated or exploited monies identified.

### OMBUDSMAN PROGRAM

5,491 long-term care visits to improve resident quality of life.

### SENIOR PROGRAMS

- 1,142,740 meals served at 212 senior center locations.
- 4,534,081 total home-delivered meals served.

### DHSS IN ACTION

A couple is facing decades in prison for **stealing millions in land and money from an elderly couple** suffering from memory issues.

### HOME AND COMMUNITY BASED SERVICES

68,000 seniors and individuals with disabilities served monthly on average..

### TOBACCO CESSATION

4,170 Missourians enrolled in Missouri Tobacco Quit Services.

### WOMEN'S HEALTH

- 4,053 women provided with free breast and cervical screening or diagnostic services.
- 24 hospitals joined the SAFEVT Network to provide sexual assault exams via telehealth.

### COMMUNICABLE DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION

140 communicable disease outbreaks investigated, approximately.

### ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

6,062 environmental health inspections completed in childcare facilities, summer programs, food manufacturers and the Missouri State Fair.

## IMMUNIZATIONS

1,003,508 doses of vaccines issued by providers of underserved children.

## VITAL RECORDS

196,768 vital records processed for critical life events of Missourians.

## PHYSICIAN RETENTION

16 Graduate Medical Education slots funded, 25 residents in training.

## WIC

96,410 women, infants and children (on average) served by the supplemental nutrition program monthly.

## DENTAL HEALTH

- 68,221 students in 684 schools were provided oral health education and preventive services.
- 134 veterans were provided dental services, covering \$20,881 in care.

## HARM REDUCTION

- 41,836 direct overdose prevention service encounters.
- 10,658 rides to connect individuals with treatment and recovery services.
- 69,317 doses of naloxone distribution supported.

### DHSS IN ACTION

Salmonellosis **outbreak** in a hospital's neonatal intensive care unit, impacting the health of **8 fragile newborns who survived.**

## STATE PUBLIC HEALTH LABORATORY SERVICES

- 43 local, 52 national foodborne outbreaks detected.
- 95,887 specimens tested for sexually transmitted infections.
- 83,706 screenings for genetic/metabolic conditions on newborns.

## SEXUAL HEALTH

53,538 doses of medication shipped for sexually transmitted infections.
