*Proclamation*  
BY THE GOVERNOR

**WHEREAS**, Jackson Warren joined the Butler County Fire Protection District as a full-time firefighter on October 18, 2021, and sacrificed time with his family and other activities in order to train and respond to fires and other life-threatening emergencies as a member of the district; and

**WHEREAS**, because of his dedication, reliability, and firefighting and leadership skills, Firefighter Warren was promoted to Shift Commander on March 6, 2026; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 6, 2026, Shift Commander Warren was driving a brush truck to respond to a grass fire when the vehicle was involved in a single-vehicle crash, killing Shift Commander Warren in the line of duty; and

**WHEREAS**, firefighters courageously and selflessly devote their lives to ensuring the safety and well-being of their fellow citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, the people of the State of Missouri are thankful for the sacrifices of the brave emergency responders who risk their own lives to protect the lives and property of their fellow citizens.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, MIKE KEHOE, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI**, as a mark of respect for the death of

**SHIFT COMMANDER JACKSON WARREN**

and for his bravery and service to the Butler County Fire Protection District and the citizens of Butler County, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of Missouri shall be flown at half-staff at every fire station in the State of Missouri and at the Fire Fighters Memorial, located in Kingdom City, Missouri, and at all government buildings in Butler County from sunrise until sunset on March 12, 2026.
