



The Homeowner Navigation Grant Fund

Join us in launching a pilot grant program dedicated to helping vulnerable homeowners who have received housing orders from the City of Minneapolis after a property inspection.

Who would qualify?

Grant funds would be available to Homeowner Navigation Program participants. The Homeowner Navigation Program (HNP) assists seniors, veterans, and disabled homeowners in addressing open housing orders, deferred property maintenance, and in-home safety hazards using a variety of community resources. HNP builds partnerships with community groups, government, non-profit organizations, and homeowners to remedy housing violations and safety issues.

What would the grant be used for?

Some clients have needs that can't be fully addressed by our community partners. Often, a one-time grant is all that is needed to replace an unsafe appliance, purchase homeowner's insurance, or address another immediate need. These grants would be used when all other resources have been exhausted.

Who will administer the program?

The Homeowner Navigation Grant Fund will be administered by Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity. In addition to managing the fund, Habitat will help the homeowner complete the repair which is often the most difficult part of the job for the homeowner. The fund will provide grants up to \$3,000 to seniors, veterans, and disabled homeowners for emergency repairs, gap funding, and to overcome obstacles. Qualified Minneapolis homeowners will only be able to apply once every 12 months. With your help, this pilot fund will help up to 25 HNP clients stay safe in their homes in 2019.
