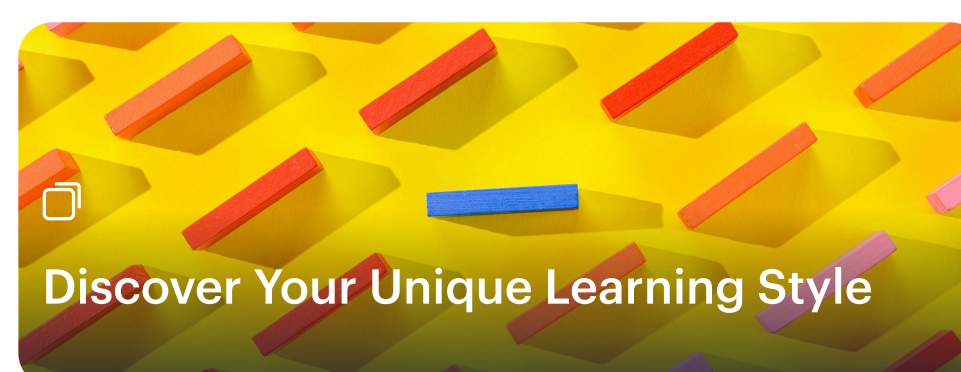
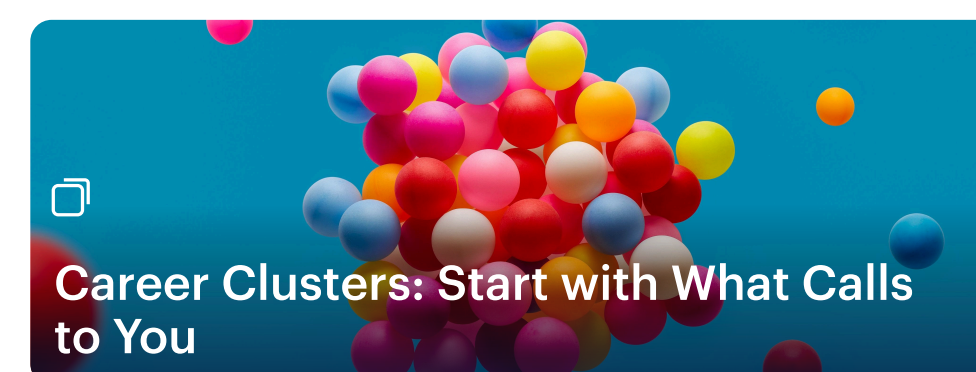
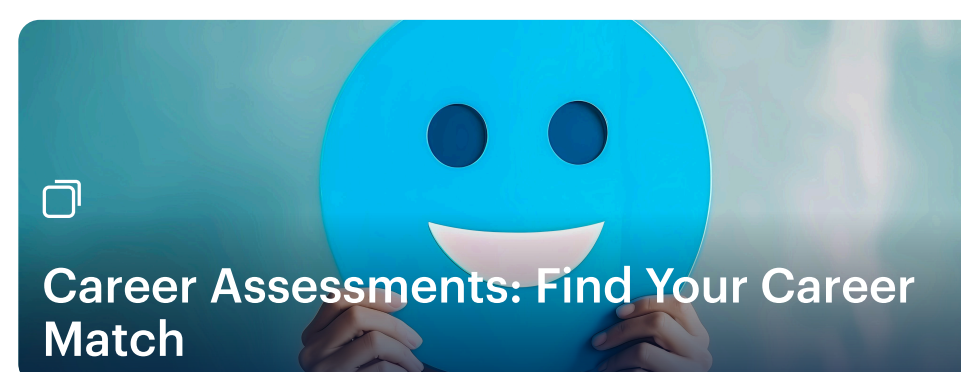

Overview




Through its statewide partnership with the Montana Office of Public Instruction (OPI), Level All provides **free, lifelong access** to a college, career, and life-readiness platform for Montana students, educators, and families. As of early 2026, the work has moved from awareness into active implementation across districts, schools, and programs statewide.
