RE:	Deaf-Blind Intervener Training Opportunities (Open Hands Open Access)

"Deaf-blindness creates very unique and complex challenges caused by the concomitant effect of both vision and hearing loss. These challenges are mainly in the area of communication, concept development, social and emotional development. An intervener responds to these challenges by serving as a link between the learner and his or her world, and by helping to expand it" (Alsop, et. Al., 2007).

Open Hands Open Access (OHOA) was created by individuals working with children who are deaf-blind for the purpose of providing training for interveners. Interveners are paraprofessionals who are specially trained to work one to one with children who are deaf-blind. The primary responsibility is to be certain that the child has access to all information and activities that occur during the school day.

The Deaf-Blind Project would like to inform LEAs of two (2) exciting possibilities for educators:

The ECU Teacher Support Project (TSP) is recruiting individuals working directly with learners with deaf-blindness in *intervener* or *instructional assistant* positions to join the new Intervener Professional Learning Community ("Intervener PLC")! Meetings will be held on a regular basis (both face-to-face and virtual). During these facilitated sessions, PLC members will complete select Open Hands, Open Access (OHOA) Deaf-Blind Intervener online training modules (<u>http://moodle.nationaldb.org/</u>) and refine their work supporting learners with deaf-blindness. The ECU TSP will provide facilitator/mentor support to PLC members studying the OHOA modules and pursuing national certification. In addition, the ECU TSP will provide a \$100 stipend for each completed OHOA module, technology as needed (e.g., iPad), as well as travel support needed by PLC members to participate in PLC activities. The Dead-Blind Project hopes to start the PLC in early to mid-October and continue the work throughout the school year.

Concurrent with the OHOA module professional development activities, PLC members are also invited to participate in the National Intervener Certification ePortfolio (NICE) process leading toward submission of a portfolio for review for national Intervener certification by the ParaCenter at the University of Colorado-Denver. PLC members making sufficient progress toward national certification will submit an ePortfolio following the 2016-2017 school year (and into the 2017-2018 school year).
