NC DPI Concussion Information and Resources:


There is a growing field of research demonstrating that individuals who sustain a concussion or mild traumatic brain injury (mTBI) lack adequate levels of follow-up care. According to a recent study published in JAMA Network Open, among 831 patients treated in hospital emergency departments for concussion, or mild traumatic brain injury (TBI), only 44 percent saw a physician or other



medical provider within three months. This article also references that approximately half of the patients were discharged **without** a handout explaining symptoms and red flags requiring follow-up.

The <u>NC DPI concussion page</u> was developed to support effective concussion management and monitoring for **ALL** NC public school students who sustain a concussion, in accordance with <u>State Board of Education Policy SHLT-001</u>.

North Carolina provides a unique opportunity for school psychologists to expand their knowledge and skills and support their school teams in conducting educationally relevant evaluations for students who sustain a brain injury and may require special education services.

NC's **Registry of TBI Approved Providers** includes information regarding the nearly 200 school psychologists who have received this specialized training. This registry also includes **NC DPI's TBI Approved Supervisors**. These supervisors are pediatric neuropsychologists across the state who provide the training for school psychologists and support enhancement of their knowledge in neuroanatomy, and skill development in advanced assessment and treatment of TBL
