PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARS PROGRAM

President Lyndon Johnson established the Presidential Scholars Program in 1964, which has honored almost 7,500 outstanding high school seniors since that time. The mission of the program is to recognize and honor superior high school seniors and thereby to encourage high attainment among all students.

Per the original Executive Order establishing the program, students are selected on the basis of outstanding scholarship. For most of the program's existence, nominees have been invited to apply for recognition based upon SAT or ACT scores. As the program has grown, candidates have been invited to apply in other ways as well. Beginning in 1979, outstanding students who demonstrated ability and accomplishment in the visual and performing arts or creative writing were added to the program. Since 2013, Chief State School Officers have been invited to nominate candidates from their states for the General component of the program. The program is also partnering with several recognition organizations that each nominate candidates for the General component of the program. And, beginning in 2016, outstanding students who demonstrate excellence in CTE were included for recognition.

GENERAL COMPONENT NOMINATION REQUEST

I am asking each of you to nominate one student from your LEA who demonstrates outstanding scholarship but might not otherwise be nominated through the current SAT/ACT, Arts, or CTE recognition processes. All high school seniors graduating between January and June of 2019, who are U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents and who attend public, parochial, or independent schools, as well as those who are home-schooled, are eligible. The candidates will go through the application process, and as in the past, the 2019 U.S. Presidential Scholars will be selected by the Commission on Presidential Scholars and receive the Presidential Scholars Medallion at a ceremony in their honor in Washington, DC.

In addition, it may be useful for you to know that the reviewers will be considering the following categories when evaluating the nominees at the semifinalist and Scholar evaluation levels:

- Involvement and Service (in school and community)
- Leadership and Character
- Writing samples
- Academic achievements
- > Discretionary points for extraordinary achievement, heavy workload, family responsibilities, or obstacles overcome.

CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION (CTE) NOMINATION REQUEST

In addition to the above nomination, each LEA is asked to nominate one additional student to be included as a candidate for recognition for excellence in CTE.

All high school seniors who are participants of a CTE program, graduating between January and June 2019, who are U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents and who attend public, parochial, or independent schools, as well as those who are home-schooled, are eligible. Please see the attachment for suggested criteria.

In order for students to be considered for this recognition in 2019 at the state level, we need all nominations by **October 12**. Each state can nominate 20 students in the general component category and five additional students for the CTE recognition component. State-level nominees are due to the Commission on Presidential Scholars by November 21. The nomination form for the General Category is attached. The nomination form for the CTE Scholars will be sent to CTE Directors. State-level nominees will be notified that their information has been elevated to the Commission on Presidential Scholars.

We recognize that the turnaround for these nominations is quick; however, your assistance with this very worthwhile endeavor is appreciated, as it is important that we recognize and highlight the extraordinary talents of our outstanding North Carolina students. All 2019 U.S. Presidential Scholars will be selected by the Commission on Presidential Scholars and will receive the Presidential Scholars Medallion at a ceremony in their honor in Washington, DC.
