## Part XI - Temporarily Waive Certain Requirements Related to Driving Eligibility Certificates

- The PSU shall issue the Driver Eligibility Certificate <u>without requiring</u> the person to whom it is issued to be making progress toward obtaining a high school diploma or its equivalent.
- The PSU shall not issue if the student is currently revoked due to disciplinary reasons noted on driver eligibility certificate.
- Districts <u>shall not report</u> students (in SADLS) who are <u>no longer making progress</u> toward obtaining a high school diploma or its equivalent. (Note: if this is done in error, the DMV will issue a suspension order.)
- Inform students of other DMV requirements,
  - Required documents Identification, driver education certificate
  - Appointments Are recommended (walk-ins may be accommodated providing space and personnel.)

End Date: January 30, 2022

## Part XII - Division of Motor Vehicles shall restore driver permits/license for those whose permit or license was revoked due to academic ineligibility.

- DMV <u>has restored</u> licenses/permits <u>and expunged</u> records of student licenses/permits suspended on or after March 1, 2020, due to grades only.
  - o If students possess their unexpired license, no further action is needed.
  - If active and lost or address change is needed, they may order a duplicate via the site below. There is a \$13 fee for these services.
  - If status remains revoked, they may have other issues separate from this legislation.
