Subpart 1

Definitions



State Agency

 an agency of State government responsible for providing free public education for children in institutions for neglected or delinquent children, community day programs for neglected or delinquent children, and adult correctional institutions.

Regular Program of Instruction

an education program (not beyond grade 12) in an institution or a community day program for neglected or delinquent children that consists of classroom instruction in basic school subjects such as reading, mathematics, and vocationally oriented subjects, and that is supported by non-Federal funds

Neither the manufacture of goods within the institution nor activities related to institutional maintenance are considered classroom instruction.

Eligibility Requirements

State Agencies

Eligibility Requirements for State Agencies

State Agency	Hours of Weekly Instruction
Adult Correctional Institution	15 or more
Institution for Delinquent Children & Youth *Average length of stay of at least 30 days	20 or more
Community Day Program	20 or more

Average Length of Stay =

length of time each child entering the institution stays



total number of children passing through that institution during a given year.

The average length of stay for all children in the institution must equal at least 30 days.

An individual child in an institution, however, would not necessarily have to stay for 30 days.

Which students are counted?

Subpart 1

To be eligible, a child must be:

Under 21 years of age

Receiving education from the State Agency

Enrolled in a regular program of instruction supported by non-federal funds for at least:

 20 hours per week if in an institution for neglected or delinquent children or a community day program for neglected or delinquent children; or

15 hours per week if in an adult correctional institution




What dates are used for the count?

Subpart 1

 Report the number of children enrolled in the SOP on a date during the calendar year 2022, selected by the State Agency

 Use the same date for every program


Subpart 2

Definitions



Neglected Institution

 A public or private residential facility, other than a foster home, operated primarily for the childcare of children who have been committed or placed in the institution due to abandonment, neglect, or death of their parents




Delinquent Institution

 A public or private residential facility operated for the care of children who have been adjudicated as delinquent or in need of supervision

 This category also includes children in LOCAL adult correctional institutions





 To be eligible to be counted, a child, age 5 through 17, must <u>live</u> in a locally operated facility that meets the definition of an institution for neglected children, an institution for delinquent children, or an adult correctional institution

Guidance for Identifying Eligible Children Subpart 2



To qualify, a student must have spent at least one day in the facility during the collection period



Each PSU (District, Lab, Charter) will submit a count for the following categories of institutions:

- ~ Local NEGLECTED institutions
- ~ Local DELINQUENT institutions



Charter/Lab Schools will have a count of 0, unless they operate as a residential facility for neglected or delinquent students

Guidance for Identifying Eligible Children Subpart 2

Students within a given institution should be counted as either neglected <u>or</u> delinquent


➤ Use the original charter of the institution to determine whether students are reported as neglected <u>or</u> delinquent



What dates are used for the count?

Subpart 2

 The collection period must run for 30 consecutive days, with at least one day falling in the month of October 2022.


