





Euro Challenge Overview

Funded by the Delegation of the European Union to the U.S., and implemented by the nonprofit Working in Support of Education (W!se), the Euro Challenge is an annual economics competition for high schools students.

The competition introduces young people to both macroeconomics and the European Union. Teams of 3-5 students pick from one of the 20 EU member countries within the euro area to present an example of how to meet a current economic challenge (they can choose from 5 topics).

25 teams are sponsored by the EU Delegation to travel and stay in New York City for the semi-finals and finals, where they present before notable academics and diplomats. The final 2-5 teams are awarded a funded trip to Washington, D.C.
