In 2020, Society Awards moved from New York to Charlotte, NC, and as a tribute to his new home state, founder David Moritz has created the Society Awards Youth Renaissance Scholarship.

The scholarship seeks to inspire students to think outside traditional boundaries and contribute to the evolution of visual arts in diverse and unique ways. It aims to instill the belief that art should be an integral part of everyday life and encourages graduates to consider careers in the artistic enhancement of public, community, and commercial spaces.

Beginning in 2024, three winning students will receive financial awards of \$10,000, \$3,000, and \$2,000 to attend further education in the visual arts. Students will be nominated by their art teachers and will submit art portfolios to be considered by a panel of impartial judges. Society Awards will seed the fund and cover administrative costs in partnership with the consultancy Youth Renaissance Project. In this way, donors can be assured that their funds will be used solely to create scholarships.

All awards will be paid directly to the university or college attended by our winning scholars. Donors will receive an annual update informing you of our winners and their plans.
