Job Description

The Music & Performing Arts Teacher is a teacher of K-8 students. The Music & Performing Arts teacher is responsible for creating and implementing a comprehensive music and performing arts program which reinforces skills in communication, expression, understanding, and collaboration. This work is done through the lens of inquiry-based instruction and learning and collaboration with staff members and the community at large.

Specific Responsibilities

The Music and Performing Arts teacher's responsibilities fall under 3 categories: teaching, producing theatrical and musical community events, and supporting/building the school culture.

Teaching:

- Design and implement a music and performing arts program, aligned with the core beliefs and values of the CFCI community.
- Design and teach lessons in accordance with the North Carolina Standard Course of Study.
- Collaborate with other specialists and core classroom teachers to integrate the arts into the classroom.
- Manage student engagement and behavior.
- Other duties, as assigned

Producing:

- Direct and produce school productions annually (i.e. fall, winter, and spring performances).
- Implement new productions, as appropriate.
- Adapt scripts annually.
- Create or enlist community/volunteer help with production and concerts.
- Other duties, as assigned

School Culture and Daily School Activities:

- Share responsibility in the planning and implementing of grade level and school-wide activities and events.
- Commit to continual professional growth, participating actively in loop meetings, faculty meetings, and other meetings, as required.
- Other duties, as assigned
