#### **Applications:**

- $\bigstar$  Application window closed 4/26/2024.
- ★ CSRB interviews will take place in the Fall.

#### Ready to Open

- ★ Charter school boards that have their application approved by CSRB are given a planning year in which to prepare for their first school year.
- ★ RTO 2025: 14 schools in cohort.

#### **Amendments**

★ Any material change to the charter application must be approved pursuant to State Board of Education policy

  - OCS must answer to GA, SBE, CSRB, public records, media, attorneys, your parents/staff ...




# State of NC Charter Schools




156,149 students 9.9% total PSU enrollment \$ 1,071,911,255 state funding

# Legislative and Policy Updates



## Legislative Updates

- CSAB to CSRB
- No impact statement consideration allowed
- Subgroup performance
- Enrollment max removed for non-low performing schools – LP schools can request
- Parent's Bill of Rights
- Remote Charter Academies

# Funding in Arrears

- All PSUs initially funded using prior year Mth 2 ADM.
  - No longer based on CSADM projection.
  - Allows for better planning/adjusting for changing ADMs.
- No reduction in event ADM is lower than allotted ADM. Increase per ADM if actual is above initial funding.

## Renewal Policy/Guidelines

#### Summary of Changes

- Aligned the 10-year and Non-Renewal Guidelines to align exactly with the Renewal and Termination Statutes.
- Added specifications to the 7- and 5-year Guidelines to more clearly differentiate.
- Added Financial Noncompliance to the guidelines.
- Aligned the guidelines to what the Review Board and SBE do in practice such as additional factor consideration.
- More clearly defined terms such as "comparable", "local administrative unit", and "targeted subgroups".



## Renewal Policy/Guidelines

- Renewal Process will remain largely the same.
- The Self-Study will now instruct schools to include items such as targeted subgroups served, LEAs of enrolled students, and school improvement plans.

# Why the changes?

No substantial modifications since implementation in 2014. Since then - major charter growth and legislative/policy changes.

Provide a transparent accountability tool that is concise, easy to understand, and demonstrates accurate and relevant compliance metrics.

- ✓ focused on the most reliable indicators of charter school health
- ✓ aligned to statute, Charter Agreement, policy, and rules
- ✓ should provide an "at a glance" picture of the academic, financial, governance, and operational foundation of a school

### Timeline

2023: Began OCS discussions/work sessions in which the team reviewed every single measure and made determinations/proposals re: keep, remove, revise.

2024: OCS leadership worked with Acct/PF staff to determine final revisions.

June 2024: CSRB unanimously approved.

July-August 2024: roll out to schools/boards

Sept 2024: 2025 PF collection begins



- Update every time a new BOD Chair/Vice Chair/Admin/Title IX coordinator/EL/EC person comes in.
- How about ... calendar time to update?

Epicenter

- Epicenter is used to collect, store, and report charter school information.
- Everything from performance framework and renewals to amendments and Ready to Open is submitted and stored in Epicenter.

School/Board is responsible for updating these both!!



#### Amendments

- Anything considered a material change to an application requires an amendment.
- There are specific rules in law for these. Please contact OCS if you have questions about whether something requires an amendment or not.
- Examples of things that require approval:
  - Relocation subcampus
  - Ed Plan/curriculum
  - Lunch plan changes
  - Board Bylaws
- Most policies do not require amendment but do require BOD approval.



- Nepotism and Conflict of Interest
  - Make sure you review Section 4 of your Charter Agreement.
  - Be aware of federal requirements for COI if you receive federal funds.



- Schools must designate a liaison for children and youth experiencing homelessness. It is highly recommended that information regarding this act is posted on your website.
- Understand and follow the <u>state</u> <u>attendance</u>/enrollment rules



- Hiring and Licensure
  - Minimum 50% of your teaching staff must have a license
  - 100% of your EC staff must be licensed
  - You may not offer employment to any person on the SBE's <u>revoked license list</u>.
  - You may not offer volunteer opportunities to any person on the SBE's <u>revoked license list</u>.
