1.0 PERCENT EXTENSION WAIVER REQUEST DENIED

On February 27, 2025, the U.S. Department of Education (USED) notified the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction the state's request for a one-year extension waiver to assess more than 1.0 percent of students with an alternate assessment aligned with alternate academic achievement standards (AA-AAAS) as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) is denied. The USED cited that in the 2023–24 school year there was an increase in mathematics and science alternate assessment participation compared to the 2022–23 school year.

Waivers from exceeding the 1.0 percent participation limit are based on a state showing substantial progress in decreasing the overage percentage. As a response to this requirement, the state will conduct a targeted monitoring activity with public school units (PSUs) exceeding the 1.0 percent participation limit to assist with identifying eligible students for instruction on the appropriate content standards and participation in the appropriate assessment.

The Office of Exceptional Children and the Office of Accountability and Testing will hold two virtual office hour opportunities on Friday, March 21, 2025, to respond to general questions regarding the 1.0 Percent Extension Waiver denial.
