Pros


- Built into IC, so it is live data at all times
- Easily accommodates multiple households
- Message ability to students, staff, and families
- Teachers have ability to message families
- Streamlined Attendance Calls
- Ability to build your own specialized groups for calls
- Built in filtering to select groups based on various criteria

Deltas

- No built in translation feature
- Only one-way communication (even for teachers)
- To audio record, you have an extra step to download a file



Review Census Data






Users can now receive designated call types; however, you must configure the system to specify which individuals should receive each type.

Contact Information


- Tip: Staff members must have their work email listed first or other things won't work the way you want
- Can be set en masse
 - Communication > Messenger Administration > Contact Preferences Batch Wizard
- Preferred Language allows you to select a different language- then if a message are sent to the individual it will go in their own language only (IF you have provided the translation)




Teachers have the ability to message through the Message Center

 Teachers can send automated messages- specifically to students with missing assignments via the Message Center (if tool rights are given)



Message Logs

Communication > Messenger > Sent Message Log

- Two types of logs:
 - Your log (Census > Messenger > Sent Message Log)
 - All messages (Census > Messenger Administration > Recipient Log)
- Can search by dates and filter messages
- Can order the messages by selecting the head of the list
- Selecting the Message gives a more detailed summary of the call

- The data preview period window is from December 10th December 18th
- All issues/questions/concerns should go to your district SRC coordinator

2025 SRC First Release

- Scheduled for release by December 31st
- First Release items include Teacher Qualifications/Experience, Principal Demographics,
 Arts in Education, Advanced Learning, Accountability Measures, Economically
 Disadvantaged students, Chronic Absenteeism, School Environment, Specialized Course
 Enrollment, IB/Cambridge data, Preschool Enrollment, and School Recognitions

2025 SRC Second Release

- Scheduled to release around March 2026
- Second Release will include SAT/AP, CTE data, Class Size, College Enrollment, Discipline/Dropout data, and School Funding

Legislative Update: Year in Review

- 2025 NCGA "Long Session" began January 2025 and has not yet adjourned (but no votes expected until 2026); last NCGA action was in late October.
- Remaining Long Session Dates NCGA may or may not vote on these dates!
 - o Dec. 15, 2025 Dec. 18, 2025
 - o Jan. 12, 2026 Jan. 15, 2026
 - o Feb. 9, 2026 Feb. 12, 2026
 - o March 9, 2026 March 12, 2026
 - April 6, 2026 April 9, 2026



- 2026 NCGA "Short Session" currently set to begin April 21, 2026.
- State Budget
 - Status: <u>S257</u> has been in a "<u>conference committee</u>" since June 2025; major disagreement still seems to be planned income tax cuts approved by NCGA in 2023
 - May see state budget action closer to primary elections (March 3, 2026)


Legislative Update: Year in Review

2025 Bill Filing

- 1,794 bills filed (1,016 in House and 778 in Senate)
- 97 total bills became session laws



- NCGA staff noted <u>23 new laws relate to education</u> in some way
- Notable New K-12 Laws:
 - H959 (SL 2025-38): Various Education Changes student cell phone restrictions
 - <u>S375 (SL 2025-73): Harrison's Law</u> requirement to publish compensation info for central office employees
 - S254 (SL 2025-80): Charter School Changes expands Review Board authority
 - H805 (SL 2025-84): Prevent Sexual Exploitation/Women and Minors religious objections, parent access to library books, sleepover event regulations



Legislative Update: Year in Review

Bills To Watch (For Now)

- HB 87: Educational Choice for Children Act (ECCA).
- HB 171: Equality in State Agencies/Prohibition on DEI.
- SB 50: Freedom to Carry NC.
- SB 153: North Carolina Border Protection Act.
- SB 227: Eliminating "DEI" in Public Education.



 Asheboro City Schools has an amazing Innovation Learning Center that we have been able to develop the braiding in multiple grants. We are excited to be able to carry on additional STEM work through a new \$2.7M grant from Driving Possibilities from Toyota Manufacturing NC.

Buncombe County School

 WNCStrong: A partnership with NC State and the NC Dept. of Ag gave students from BCS the opportunity to have paid internships applying skills learned in CTE classes to help repair farms damaged by Hurricane Helene.

Burke County Public Schools

 Burke County Public Schools is planning their second annual inclusive talent show featuring students of all different abilities coming together to perform. Along the same lines, schools are planning more inclusive activities, including PE and clubs.

Chatham County Schools

- We held a successful reunification drill this summer, and are continuing our work to strengthen our process and training, including a meeting with area charter schools, so that we can assist them in their reunification planning.

By completing their grade-level WIGs (Wildly Important Goals), students earn a token to select a free book, encouraging both student growth and a lifelong love of reading.
- The project came to life thanks to a grant secured by Heather Santos, School Media Coordinator, in partnership with Craven County Partners In Education, which continues to champion innovative learning across Craven County Schools.
- Principal Melisa Thompson shared, "The book vending machine is more than just a reward, it's an
 investment in building confident readers who take pride in their accomplishments."

Currituck County Schools
