**Same Goal, Different Paths: Independence in the Americas**

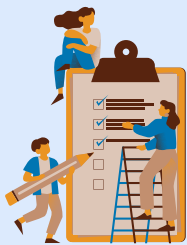

**Spice Islands in the Age of Exploration**
