MTSS

The goal of the MTSS Expansion ESSER project is to build, enhance, and expand access within the overall infrastructure of the North Dakota Multi-Tier System of Supports (NDMTSS). NDMTSS is a framework to provide all students with the best opportunities to succeed academically, socially, emotionally, and behaviorally in school. NDMTSS focuses on providing high-quality instruction and interventions matched to student needs. monitoring progress frequently to make decisions about changes in instruction or goals. Data is used to allocate resources to improve student learning and support staff implementation of effective practices. NDMTSS is a system of supports that has proven successful not only for schools but also in authoring multiple grants, programs, administrative rules, and legislative requirements in ND. In order for the system to flex, adapt, innovate, and keep up-to-date, funds have been critical to improve continuously and expand to all four corners of the state.
