

Alternate Choice Ready Raw Data






Why did our percentages go down?






Choice Ready & Accountability

What can they be used for?

Essential Skills

- Equipment for inclusive sports program.
- Purchase transition assessments to assess the following areas: jobs and job training, home/independent living, community participation, and post-secondary training and learning opportunities.
- Evaluate transportation needs for students with disabilities. consider purchasing taxi vouchers, bus tickets, etc. for students to increase attendance or access the community.
- Implementing and Early Warning Information System



Post-Secondary Ready

- Purchase workplace readiness curriculum(s) to teach skills to students with significant needs
- Funding for a college/trade school visit
- Purchase materials for students to complete Dual Credit Courses.
- Educator Pathway




Workforce Ready

- Hire personnel to assess community resources and provide students with opportunities for workplace readiness training or volunteer experiences.
- Funding for Job Site visits
- Hire a job coach for students who need training to access community employment experiences.
- Purchase virtual reality goggles, like CareerViewXR, and/or subscriptions so students can explore careers and complete job-specific tasks in jobs that are not offered in their community.



Life Skills & Military Ready

- Rent an apartment or create an "apartment" classroom where students can learn various independent living skills so they can live independently after graduation.
- Purchase kitchen supplies for classroom.
- Conduct assistive technology evaluation and purchase assistive technology devices to increase student independence. Teach students how to utilize devices.
- Tutoring for the ASVAB



How IDEA Funds can Support Initiatives School-wide for all Students to Meet Choice Ready.

Example- Choice Ready Fair

Braiding Funding Plan: To help all students become choice ready by career and opportunity exploration.

Funding Sources: IDEA, Title III, BIE, Perkins

Educator Pathway Highlight!



WHAT IS EDUCATOR PATHWAY?

High school students who are interested in entering the education field after graduation should participate in teaching experiences that drive their interest within the schools and communities in which they currently reside. Over 80% of teachers in the United States (approximately) work in school districts located within 20 miles of where they attended high school themselves (Greenberg Motamedi, Petrokubi, Yoon, & Leong, 2018).

Over the next three consecutive years (2024-2027), the NDDPI Office of Specially Designed Services will use IDEA funds to increase the number of students entering the education field. Students interested in entering the education field will receive opportunities to take dual credit courses while in high school through the Educator Pathway program. The NDDPI Office of Specially Designed Services will provide payment for college application fees, dual credit fees, and books/materials for any student taking the dual credit coursework through the Educator Pathway program.





What is the Educator Pathway Program?

- Opportunity for high school students interested in entering the teaching field after graduation.
- Over 60% of teachers in the United States work in school districts located within 20 miles of where they attended high school themselves.
- The program includes five classes students can choose to take to help prepare them to earn a degree in teaching by completing dual credit courses while still in high school.
