## **MINUTES**

**Welcome:** Supt. Baesler welcomed the group and provided opening comments.

## **Presentations:**

**Laurie Matzke,** Assistant Superintendent, started the meeting with a PowerPoint presentation on an overview of the topics to be addressed.

Stan Schauer, the Director of the Office of Assessment provided the following key updates:

- Currently in year 3 of the participation rate monitoring process.
- ACT and NDSA are no longer used as state summative assessments for yearly accountability determinations.
- ND A+ automated data feed is getting more robust.
- CR-Workforce Ready text change to replace NDSA with ND A+ summative.

**Amanda Peterson,** the Director of Educational Improvement and Support provided the following key updates:

- Identification of TSI and CSI schools.
- Potential ESSA Plan Revisions.
- NDDPI was selected for targeted monitoring on the school improvement requirements under ESSA. Discussed USED monitoring process and findings.
- Accountability reports on Insights. Due to time constraints demonstrated Insights dashboard on behalf of Ross Roemmich.
- ND First comment period.
- Workgroup to discuss accountability for "unique" schools.
