Q&A for LEAs

Q: What programs are offered for paraprofessionals who want to become North Dakota licensed teachers?

A: Currently, there are two programs to support paras to get their teaching license:

- Registered Apprenticeship Program in Teaching (RAP-T), which is funded by the State Apprenticeship Expansion Formula Grant from the US Department of Labor
- North Dakota SB 2032, commonly called Para to Teacher Program or Grow Your Own, adopted in the 2023 ND Legislative Session.

Q: Who makes the final decision on selection of paras to participate in the RAP-T program?

A: The LEA has the final decision on selection of all participants who will be employed in the LEA district.

Q: What are LEA responsibilities in the RAP-T Program?

A: In the MOU signed by the LEA and EPP, the LEA agrees to the following major points:

- Ensure each participant serves in an education assistant (also known as a paraprofessional) position for a minimum of 1-year. Clinical requirements, including student teaching, shall be arranged through the apprentice's full-time position. The LEA ensures that apprentices will not serve as the teacher-of-record during the apprenticeship.
- Be responsible for paying any additional stipends or payments provided to assigned mentor teachers.
- Allow apprentices to engage in instructional activities such as co-teaching, lesson planning, small groups, tutoring, professional learning, and grading.
- Not assign non-instructional duties during the instructional day, such as

lunchroom monitoring, substitute teaching (except when the apprentice's cooperating teacher is absent), study hall, office duty, or in-school suspension. This does not limit duties assigned before or after the school day.

• <u>A</u>ssess the apprentice's progress along on-the-job competencies and make a final recommendation of competency mastery to the EPP.
