#### Objectives:

1. Participants will be able to define Social Development in children.
2. Participants will be able to define Emotional Development in children.
3. Participants will be able to describe the importance of intentional practices to promote healthy social and emotional development.

#### Description:

Are you interested in learning more about challenging behaviors in early childhood? We will spend an hour exploring ways to address behaviors using a framework of evidence-based practices designed to promote healthy social and emotional development in infants, toddlers, and young children. These healthy social and emotional practices help young children develop skills to support them as they become citizens. Implementing these evidence-based practices prevents challenging behaviors and focuses on building



adults' skills to support children's social and emotional health, helping to reduce inappropriate discipline practices, promoting family engagement, and using data to make decisions to support children's development.

#### **Objectives:**

3. Participants will be able to examine their self-awareness, emotional intelligence, and social and emotional skills in supporting children's development in these areas.

#### **Description:**

An early childhood professional's understanding of their own self-awareness, emotional intelligence, and social and emotional learning is crucial to supporting a deeper understanding of emotions. Being a reflective early childhood professional allows one to be knowledgeable about emotional development and more effectively scaffold children's ability to label emotions and empathize with their complex emotional experiences. Understanding emotions is essential for creating a positive learning environment and supporting children's development effectively.

Through reflective discussions, we will explore insights into understanding the underlying causes of challenging behavior, discuss how to respond empathetically and



teach skills so children can best describe their feelings, frustrations, and solutions. Join us to create a supportive environment where every child feels valued and understood.

We will explore practical strategies to help children recognize and describe their emotions. Labeling emotions gives children the vocabulary and awareness needed to communicate and manage their feelings effectively. We will discuss activities and real-life examples to create an emotionally supportive environment and help children develop the vocabulary to describe their emotions.

We will also discuss practical examples and strategies to promote healthy emotional, cognitive, and linguistic development, ultimately supporting children's self-regulation abilities.

### Objectives:

1. Participants will discuss reflective practices used in early childhood settings.
2. Participants will explain why a developmental lens is essential when interpreting children's behavior.

### Description:

Understanding and responding to children's behavior is a daily task for caregivers and families in early childhood settings. Like detectives, we can sharpen our skills by using reflective practices and applying our knowledge of child development. We will look at reflective practices such as observing, collecting data, applying developmental knowledge, and exploring underlying factors that support or hinder a child's behavior and development.

### Objectives:

1. Participants will define Punishment.
2. Participants will define Guidance.
3. Participants will describe the difference between Punishment and Guidance.
4. Participants will summarize how guidance techniques can enhance children's ability to label emotions and communication skills.

### Description:

We will discuss practical strategies for supporting young children's social-emotional development. We will recognize the difference between punishment and guidance. Punishing children for challenging behavior is counterproductive. Instead, we will focus on fostering essential skills for getting along with others. We will discuss practical techniques to promote empathy, conflict resolution, and positive interactions. A nurturing environment is where children begin to develop these lifelong skills.

We will explore a holistic approach to understanding and addressing challenging behavior in children. Behavior is a form of communication, and every behavior conveys a message. We will learn to consider the underlying causes or connections when deciding how to respond to a child's behavior. We will look at behavior as communication and discuss teaching and modeling skills using appropriate guidance techniques.

3. Participants will discuss ways to incorporate transition strategies that support the child, supportive environment, and caregiver.

### **Descriptions:**

Transitions are pivotal moments in a child's day. A child has to move from one activity to another, from home to school, or within daily routines, often at the expectation of the child versus the choice of the child. As early childhood professionals, we recognize that these transitions can be challenging for children, families, and caregivers alike. We will discuss effective strategies to support children, families, and caregivers during these critical moments.
