UPDATES TO THE SCHOOL NUTRITION STANDARDS EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2025

Added Sugars Product- Based Limits

- Breakfast cereals: no more than 6 g per dry oz
- Yogurt: no more than 12 g per 6 oz
- Flavored milk: no more than 10 g per 8 fl oz

Vegetable Variety at Breakfast

 Schools must offer at least two vegetable subgroups at breakfast per week, if offering vegetables in place of fruit at breakfast more than once per week.

NSLP Snacks Meal Pattern

 NSLP afterschool snack meal pattern requirements for K-12 children update to align with the CACFP snack meal pattern requirements.

Meal Modifications for Disabilities

 Schools must accept medical statements provided by registered dietitians requesting meal modifications on behalf of students with disabilities.

FLUID MILK REQUIREMENTS

Maintain existing fluid milk requirements

- Fat Free or Low/Skim Fat, flavored or unflavored milk
- 2 varieties; required component for breakfast & lunch
- Sugar-based limits for flavored milk: no more than 10 g of added sugar per 8 ounces
- Substitutions must be nutritionally equivalent to cow's milk (see production records) unless there is a signed medical statement due to disability

SUBSTITUTING VEG AT BREAKFAST

Greater flexibility and more local control! Previously required specific vegetable subgroups.

- If substituting 1 time per week, ANY vegetable subgroup
- If substituting 2+ times per week, different vegetable subgroups.

SUBSTITUTING VEG FOR GRAIN

Tribal communities & American Samoa, Guam, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, & US Virgin Islands

- ½ cup vegetables = 1-ounce equivalent grains
- Must have different vegetable for veg. component
- Preference for culturally relevant vegetables
 - beans, corn, squash, prairie turnip, taro, jicama, chayote, tomatillos, etc

FEES FOR ELECTRONIC PAYMENTS

Starting school year 2027-2028

- No fee allowed for electronic payments from Free and Reduced students
- Free payment method required
 - Fee for electronic payment is allowable
- Notify families of available payment options/fees
- Payment method available for families
 - who do not have access to a computer
 - who do not have bank accounts

NSLP EQUIPMENT GRANTS

NSLP Equipment Grant Proposals may include reasonable costs for:

- Installation: delivery, testing and disposal of old equipment
- Minor kitchen remodel such as moving an electrical outlet
- Necessary attachments & accessories
- Ancillary charges such as taxes, freight

BUY AMERICAN: ACCOMMODATION PROCESS FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2025-2026

Schools that will not meet the 10% cap for SY 25-26 can apply for a 'temporary relief' for this first year.

- -Documentation of all nondomestic items that have been purchased, causing the 10% cap to be exceeded.
 - -Written plan to bring purchases under 10% cap.



Reiteration that Nonprofit School Foodservice Account (NPSFA) can be used to purchase local foods.


PAID LUNCH EQUITY **GUIDANCE FOR 2025-2026**

For SY 25-26, exemption from PLE tool if ending balance of NPSFA is zero or positive.

If negative balance, PLE tool must be completed and requirements implemented.

2025 ENHANCING CNP MEAL STANDARDS

Federal meal patterns can be made more restrictive at the state and local level.

- Examples
 - State prohibits dyes in school food
 - Local requires all food to be scratch cooked, rather than using processed.

REIMBURSEMENT FOR OFF-SITE MEAL CONSUMPTION

Reviews exceptions to Congregate Meal service during the school year:

- Any time students are off campus during meal service for school related function
 - Examples but not limited to:
 - Field Trips
 - Dual credit college classes
 - Work study
 - -Check with NDDPI-CNFD for allowability


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
