



2019 Green Eggs and Sand Workshop

With option for NJ teachers to sign up for
Horseshoe Crabs in the Classroom

June 1-2, 2019

The Wetlands Institute, Stone Harbor, NJ

Green Eggs and Sand is a curriculum (developed by Maryland DNR, Delaware Fish & Wildlife and NJ Division of Fish and Wildlife) centered around the horseshoe crab. At the workshop participants learn from experts about the biology of the horseshoe crab, their relationship to shorebirds, their importance to humans, and how the species is managed. Participants also get to run through several of the activities found in the Green Eggs and Sand curriculum, as well as get into the field during peak horseshoe crab spawning.

This is an optional two part workshop.

Part One Green Eggs and Sand

Open to ALL educators. By attending this workshop you will receive the Green Eggs and Sand curriculum plus other education materials. Spend two days experiencing and investigating the Delaware Bay's horseshoe crab phenomena—learning from experts, participating in hands-on activities and a trip to see horseshoe crab spawning.

Part Two Horseshoe Crabs in the Classroom *(limited to first 12 New Jersey teachers)*

Open to New Jersey educators only. After the Green Eggs and Sand workshop on Sunday, there will be a session on tank set up and how to prepare for horseshoe crab hatchlings you'll receive in September. Teachers who sign up for this will be given all the necessary equipment to raise horseshoe crabs. Then in September at a date TBD, teachers will return to the Wetlands Institute for a half day workshop to review care and maintenance of horseshoe crabs and tank, discuss real science data collection, and pick-up the hatchlings.

More about the workshop: The Green Eggs & Sand workshop commences Saturday morning, June 1 and ends at noon on Sunday, June 2. Interspersed with expert presenters on horseshoe crabs (HSCs), shorebirds, biomedical use of HSCs, and HSC management, are sessions that explore the GE&S curriculum and provide demonstrations of the rich assortment of the hands-on activities it offers. A field trip to Delaware Bay beach are a special highlight of the weekend, including the opportunity to observe nighttime spawning of HSCs, to tag horseshoe crabs, and more!

About the lodging: Lodging will be in cabins with bathrooms at the Ponderosa Campground in Cape May Court House (visit <http://www.ponderosacampground.com/>). Participants will have to share accommodations. Each cabin has its own bathroom, air conditioning, and porch. Cabins have one double bed and one set of bunk beds. Participants are asked to bring their own bed linens, blanket and pillow. You have the option to come in on Friday night but dinner will be on your own. For those who seek alternative accommodations, a list of nearby motels/hotels is available, and reservations for such are to be made by individuals at their own expense.

Please indicate your lodging preferences, along with any special dietary or accommodation needs on the registration form. Space is limited and registrations are taken on a first-come-first-serve basis. No-shows or cancellations that do not provide at least 2 weeks prior-to-workshop notice result in a forfeiture of registration fees.

Full attendance at all workshop sessions is required for receipt of the curriculum package.
