I am excited to announce the 2021 recruitment period for the Columbus Youth Council (CYC), a collaborative partnership between Columbus City Council and Columbus City Schools.

The Columbus Youth Council (CYC) program gives high school juniors and seniors from Columbus high schools an opportunity to immerse themselves in city government and learn how they can become stewards in their community.

Students will participate in interactive lessons on a range of topics including the structure of city government, economic development, police and community relations, and much more.

Although our entire world has changed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and the renewed fight for racial justice, I believe it is more important than ever that we provide these opportunities for our future generation of leaders to learn and grow. We will host this experience virtually in order to comply with the health and safety recommendations of our public health experts. Students accepted to participate in the program will be provided with tools for their success, including meal vouchers and program supplies.

I truly believe this will be a transformational experience for students who apply. I encourage anyone that is curious about this opportunity to get their application in as soon as possible.

Interested students should speak with their Principal or Guidance Counselors and ask for a reference to fill out the application. My team will select 20 students from Central Ohio schools, including Columbus City High School students.

WHAT IS THE CYC?

Students selected to the Columbus Youth Council (CYC) will have an opportunity to learn about city government and how they can become stewards in their community.

They will be participating in several lessons dealing with topics such as the structure of city government, city development, what municipalities can and cannot do, and much more.

Virtual classes will begin at 10:00 am and end at 1:30 pm. Meal vouchers and program supplies will be provided.

For their service on Columbus Youth Council, students will;

- Gain a greater understanding of city government and how local leaders make a difference.
- Enhance their skills in civic engagement and local leadership, becoming stewards of their community.
- Meet City leaders and have this experience on their resume for life after high school.
- Earn hours toward their high school volunteer commitment
- Receive special recognition from the City of Columbus for their participation in the program.

MEMBERSHIP STRUCTURE:

- 20 members from various Columbus high schools
- Current Juniors and Seniors

COURSE OUTLINE (cont.):

Any junior or senior CCS student may apply to the Columbus Youth Council, but they must have a teacher nomination letter attached to their application.

The Youth Council board will select the most qualified student from each school to serve on the council for a term of 1 year.

A replacement will also be selected from each school in case the student chosen is not able to fulfill his/her commitment.

HOW TO APPLY:

- Applications available from students Teachers/Guidance Counselors beginning May, 26th 2021
- Completed applications must be received by August 2, 2021
- Selected program participants will be notified by August 9, 2021

PROGRAM COMMITMENT

Youth Council members will meet once a month for a total of 5 meetings. Members will need to attend all meetings to participate.

In addition, there will be monthly projects that Youth Council members must complete in order to stay enrolled in the council. If any student knows that they will be unable to fulfill their commitment, they should not apply to the program when nominated.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE:

- Program will be held virtually
- The Council is led by city legislative staffers with youth development and policy making backgrounds, and supported with parental volunteering.
- Monthly meetings will be held on the first Wednesday from 10:00am-1:30pm
- Meal vouchers and program supplies will be provided.

• Transportation will be the responsibility of the students, we will provide COTA bus passes if needed.
