

2019 YEAR IN REVIEW: OHIO EMA TRAINING AND EXERCISE

During 2019, Ohio EMA training coordinators Lisa Jones and Matthew Jaksetic supported 103 trainings. These trainings consisted of 1,627 classroom hours and instruction to 2,215 students with an average of 22 students per training. Thirty counties applied for, and received training. Ohio EMA hosted 12 trainings at its Columbus headquarters.

Ohio EMA approved and submitted 553 Residential National Domestic Preparedness Consortium (NDPC) applications for students to attend residential courses at the training provider's sites and submitted 92 EMI Applications for students to attend residential training at FEMA's Emergency Management Institute (EMI) in Emmitsburg, MD. In addition, we approved and submitted 155 EMI applications for students to attend 16 EMI Mobile "L" courses hosted in Ohio. Likewise, we approved the delivery of 20 mobile NDPC courses in Ohio with 2147 students in attendance; and 10 Mobile Rural Domestic Preparedness Consortium (RDPC) courses delivered to 96 students in Ohio.


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2020 OHIO EMA SPRING CONFERENCE

GRANTS UPDATE – ANNUAL INVENTORY CERTIFICATION

When the holidays roll around, it's time to check out presents of the past: grant equipment purchases! Who needs new presents when we can inventory purchases of grants-past?!

Per Ohio EMA Policy Statement 2015 (1), equipment from any preparedness grant passed through Ohio EMA are to be inventoried annually. This includes submitting an Annual Inventory Certification along with a current Master Asset Listing to the Grants Branch no later than January 31 of each year. Check out the [Grants Tool Kit](#) for a copy of both forms.

There are benefits to using the provided Master Asset Listing for your grant purchased equipment. First, all headings required by the 2 CFR 200.313 are included in the spreadsheet. Second, the sort function of the Excel spreadsheet can help identify any equipment by heading. For example, if you need to find out what equipment was purchased in a certain year or the date of your last physical inventory, using the sorting tool is quick and easy.

If you are wondering what qualifies as "equipment," 2 CFR 200.33 defines it as: "property having a useful life of more than one year and a per-unit acquisition cost which equals or exceeds ...\$5,000." And while federal law requires that only equipment be inventoried, FEMA suggests sub recipients may consider including supplies purchased in aggregate of \$5,000 in their inventory. Per the Ohio EMA policy statement 2015 (1), equipment on your Master Asset Listing should remain in inventory for the life of the qualifying equipment. Upon disposition of equipment, it should still be kept on the Master Asset Listing for at least three years after final disposition per 2 CFR 200.333 (c).

FREE HAZMAT TRAINING

As more and more rail traffic transports cargo, including hazardous materials, it is important that the responder community becomes educated about the dangers and unique hazards presented with railcars carrying these commodities. The information covered in this Department of Transportation Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (DOT PHMSA) approved and funded **Rail Car Incident Response for Crude, Ethanol, and Other Flammable Liquids** training course will enhance the ability of emergency responders to assess the scene of a rail car incident, understand the resources needed to remediate the emergency situation, including how the railroad will play a critical role in the response.



Hands-on scenarios using a rail car simulator are conducted to emphasize the objectives of the training including:

- Identifying the design, construction, components and markings of railcars carrying crude/flammable liquids.
- Recognizing and identifying the chemical being transported, and the properties that must be considered in an emergency.
- Assessing the scene to determine the potential hazards to people, property, and the environment.
- Recognizing mitigation strategies including offensive, defensive, and non-intervention strategies for fire and/or spill incidents.
- Identifying key resources in the rail/freight industry, as well as federal, state, and private resources for response assistance.

Virtual Instructor Led Training (VILT) Awareness Courses

Virtual Instructor Led Training (VILT) courses provide general awareness level counter-improvised explosive device (C-IED) information to a broad audience through an on-line virtual training experience with a live instructor. These courses enhance participants' awareness and capability to prevent, protect against, respond to, and mitigate attacks that use IEDs against people, critical infrastructure, and other soft targets. Perfect for participants with time availability constraints, and the participants can take them as stand-alone courses or they can serve as prerequisites for many of the instructor-led courses provided by the Office for Bombing Prevention (OBP).
