Ohio's COVID-19 Vaccination Program is underway. Because the supply of vaccine is currently limited, Ohio's program is designed to first get the vaccine in the arms of Ohioans who are most vulnerable and at-risk. As more vaccine becomes available, eligibility to receive the vaccine will be expanded.

Date	Eligibility Criteria
January 19	Ages 80 and older.
January 25	Ages 75 and older. Those with severe congenital, developmental, and early onset medical disorders.
February 1	Ages 70 and older. Employees of K-12 schools that wish to remain or return to in-person or hybrid learning.
February 8	Ages 65 and older.

All available vaccines will be administered to those who choose to receive it.

Who is eligible for a vaccine?

Phase 1b began January 19th and runs through the week of February 8th. Each week additional Ohioans become eligible to receive the vaccine. If you fall into one of the groups identified in the chart above, **make a plan**. Determine where you want to go to get vaccinated and how to schedule an appointment. Scheduling typically begins several days before the start date illustrated in the chart and appointment times fill fast. If you can't get an appointment the first week you become eligible, don't give up. Keep trying! Stay up-to-date on vaccine eligibility at the [Ohio Department of Health vaccination program site](https://vaccine.coronavirus.ohio.gov/).

If you don't fall into one of the groups identified, maybe a family member or elderly neighbor does. If so, reach out to them. Navigating the vaccination and scheduling process can be difficult and the information provided below could be beneficial to them.

How can I schedule an appointment to receive a vaccine?

Currently, vaccines are being administered by hospital systems (OhioHealth, Mount Carmel and The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center), public health departments (Columbus and Franklin County Public Health) and limited pharmacies across central Ohio. Your primary care physician may also be able to provide direction (or options). Below is a list of local providers along with a phone number and/or website for scheduling purposes.
