ORBEG Round 2 **Project Descriptions**

The Ohio Residential Broadband Expansion Grant Program (ORBEG) is a competitive broadband grant program designed to fund last-mile broadband infrastructure projects in areas currently lacking access to reliable, high-speed internet. This program is designed to provide internet service with speeds of at least 100/100 Mbps to households upon project completion.

This round of ORBEG will fund \$94.5 million in grant funding to two internet service providers for 6 projects serving 22 counties. As part of the grant process 12 internet service providers also committed to independently fund 51 additional projects within two-years to serve an additional 10,000 households and impacting areas in 25 additional counties.
