Allen County Land Reutilization Corporation (Allen County)

Project Name: Lickity Split

\$108,219 Assessment

The project includes phase I and II environmental assessments at the former Lickity Split gas station and ice cream parlor. The building, vacant and in disrepair, will be demolished in order to access the property thoroughly.

Allen County Land Reutilization Corporation (Allen County)

Project Name: Former County Jail

\$259,750

Cleanup/Remediation

The project includes asbestos abatement, universal waste removal, and demolition of the former Allen County Jail, a 6,000-square-foot structure built in 1920. The demolition aligns with Lima's downtown master plan, facilitating the construction of a new County Administration Building and advancing local development initiatives.

Ashland Area Economic Development Inc. (Ashland County)

Project Name: Pumphouse District

\$883,000

Cleanup/Remediation

The project will include the removal of an underground storage tank, foundations, and debris from a former industrial site to prepare for a residential development featuring 192 market-rate apartments, a clubhouse, and a public park.

Project Name: Nankin Gas Station

\$116,986

Cleanup/Remediation

The project involves the remediation of petroleum-impacted soil and groundwater at a former gas station site. The site will be prepared for future commercial redevelopment once cleanup is completed.

Project Name: Remediation of the Former Townline Road Junk Yard

Cleanup/Remediation

This project involves the demolition of dilapidated structures, removal of junk and debris, and remediation of contaminated soil at a former junkyard site. A second phase will redevelop the riverfront buildings for hospitality or residential use, aiming to enhance the Flats East Bank area with additional residential and commercial spaces.

The project will demolish 61 barracks-style apartment buildings and address asbestos, lead-based paint, and soil contamination.
