


MRSS

Who is referring to MRSS? The most common referral sources into MRSS (2,248 out of 5,572) are Parents and Caregivers (40%) followed by Teachers and School Staff (21%).

MRSS Brief: Referral Sources & Gender 10/1/22 to 9/30/23





Stabilization Services

MRSS is serving a similar proportion of males (49%) compared to females (47%). Though self-referrals make up only a small group, females (75%) are of a higher percentage than males (19%). Hospitals and medical facilities refer females (61%) at a higher percentage than males (35%), and shelters/supportive service refer males (59%) at a higher percentage than females (37%).



Of those that receive MRSS services, referrals from Crisis Teams (66%), Self-Referrals (65%), and Parents/Caregivers (64%) receive 4-42 Days of Stabilization Services at a higher proportion compared to other referral groups. Referrals from Teachers and School Staff receive 3 Days or Less of Mobile Response Only Services at a higher proportion than other groups (55%).

MRSS Brief: Referral Source and High-Risk Presenting Concerns from 10/1/22 to 9/30/23



87% youth referred to MRSS (4,465 out of 5,148) were referred due to one or more of the following high-risk presenting concerns: Suicidality, Anger/ Aggression/Physical Outbursts, Depression, Self-Injury/Harm, Homicidal Ideation, Unsafe/Risky Behavior, Domestic Violence, Psychosis, and Human Trafficking. **Hospitals and Medical Facility have the highest percentage of youth referred with high-risk presenting concerns**.
