WHO WILL BENEFIT

Advocates, guardians ad litem, counselors, therapists, adult and child protective service workers, medical professionals, law enforcement officers, attorneys, funeral home professionals who work with families of those lost to homicide, and others who serve victims

WHAT YOU'LL LEARN ABOUT

- Ohio's Crime Victim Compensation Program application process
- The rollout of new software for the Sexual Assault Forensic Examination (SAFE) Program, which ensures that victims of sexual assault have their evidence collected uniformly, and the state's Sexual Assault Kit Tracking System, which keeps victims updated on the status of that evidence
- The work of AGO's Elder Justice Unit and how it can be a valuable resource
