This gesture reflects the respect and gratitude of the people of Oklahoma for President Carter's service to our nation and his influence on history.

Jimmy Carter, the 39th President of the United States, served the nation with integrity and compassion. As a champion of human rights, advocate for peace, and lifelong servant to the public, President Carter's contributions to our nation as President and a private citizen stand as a testament to his unwavering commitment to the common good. From his humble beginnings in Plains, Georgia, to his presidency and humanitarian efforts, his legacy will endure in the hearts of all Americans.

A man of deep and abiding faith, President Carter often spoke of the values of humility, service, and love for one's neighbor, which guided his life and leadership. He demonstrated these principles and lived out his faith through action. He taught Sunday school for nearly four decades and built homes for the poor with Habitat for Humanity.

In recognition of his impact on our nation and his lifelong dedication to serving others, I hereby order all flags on state property to be flown at half-staff from the time this order is filed until 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 31, 2024.
