

CVI: Updates on Identification, Assessment & Intervention



Cortical Visual Impairment is the leading cause of visual impairments in children. This workshop will offer participants an opportunity to learn about the principles of CVI including: definitions, identification, assessment and intervention. There will be an emphasis on cross-discipline approaches and application of supports for students with CVI within natural contexts. Video examples and applied activities will facilitate attendee participation and generalizations of content.

She is a Certified Orientation and Mobility Specialist and has a Master's Degree in Medically Fragile, High Risk Infants. Her PH.D. focused on Cortical Visual Impairment and Infancy. She worked as a research associate and an Assistant Professor in higher education for 17 years and was an infant development specialist associated with the NICU and Follow Up for 31 years at The Western Pennsylvania Hospital. Dr. Roman-Lantzy is the Director of The Pediatric View Program at The Children's Home & Lemieux Family Center in Pittsburgh Pennsylvania.
