

Behavioral Science for Teachers (BeST) Training

OSDE-Special Education Services is pleased to announce its partnership with Dr. Scott Singleton, to provide behavioral science training to district staff to increase its capacity in addressing significant student behavior.

Dr. Scott Singleton BCBA-D, NCSP has worked in the behavioral science and education field for over 20 years. He has served as a school psychologist in multiple states, the response to intervention coordinator for a large urban school district, clinical director for a school for children with developmental disabilities and is currently a professor of psychology at the University of Central Oklahoma where he oversees Behavior Central, a center for teacher training and behavioral consultation, and the master's program in behavior analysis.



Team Training:

Participation **requires a district team including a minimum of two district personnel with a maximum of four district personnel.** Enlisted team members are required to attend *both* days of training.
