Dr. Scott Singleton BCBA-D, NCSP has worked in the behavioral science and education field for over 20 years. He has served as a school psychologist in multiple states, the response to intervention coordinator for a large urban school district, clinical director for a school for children with developmental disabilities and is currently a professor of psychology at the University of Central Oklahoma where he oversees Behavior Central, a center for teacher training and behavioral consultation, and the master's program in behavior analysis.



Team Training:

Participation **requires a district team including a minimum of two district personnel with a maximum of four district personnel**. Enlisted team members are required to attend *both* days of training.
