Rural Health Transformation Program-Brandie Combs, OSDH Chief of Staff

- Brandie Combs provided a detailed update on the \$50 billion [federal Rural Health transformation Program](#)
- She covered the application process, funding structure (competitive and noncompetitive pots), and the focus on stakeholder engagement and sustainability.
- The Oklahoma State Department of Health has created a website to share updates

- Oklahoma's application is due on November 5, with the Oklahoma State Department of Health as the lead agency, supported by multiple state partners and Boston Consulting Group
- Extensive stakeholder engagement has been conducted, including an RFI that received nearly 400 responses, targeted meetings with hospital partners and regional outreach.
- Key challenges identified in listening sessions include workforce shortages, transportation barriers, infrastructure needs, and chronic health conditions.
- The application must address five strategic goals (Make Rural America Healthy Again, sustainable access, workforce development, technology innovation, and innovative care) and select at least three of twelve eligible spending areas.

- Annual detailed plans and metrics are required, with the risk of funding callback if goals are not met.
- Ongoing collaboration with the legislature is focused on identifying and supporting policy changes that facilitate rural health transformation, including recent and potential legislative actions.

Family Resource Centers (FRCs) Sustainability Study:

- Adrienne Elder highlighted the importance of FRCs as community hubs, the push to include a federal definition in state statute, and the benefits of FRCs for family and community stability.
- The study aims to support policy change and sustainable funding for FRCs across Oklahoma.

- Dr. Fahad Khan shared the Urban League of Greater Oklahoma has been designated as the first Pathways Community Hub in Oklahoma
