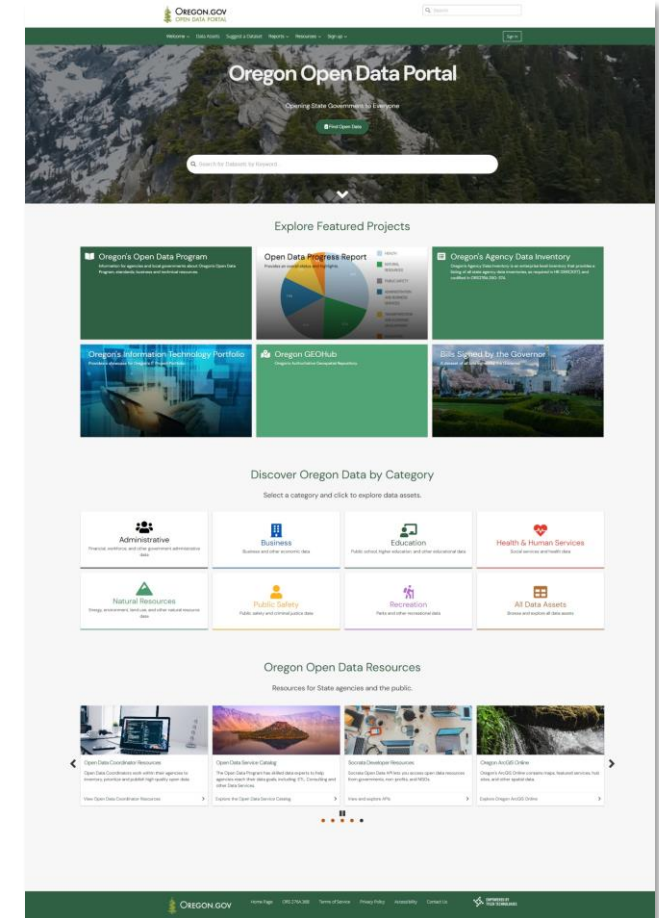

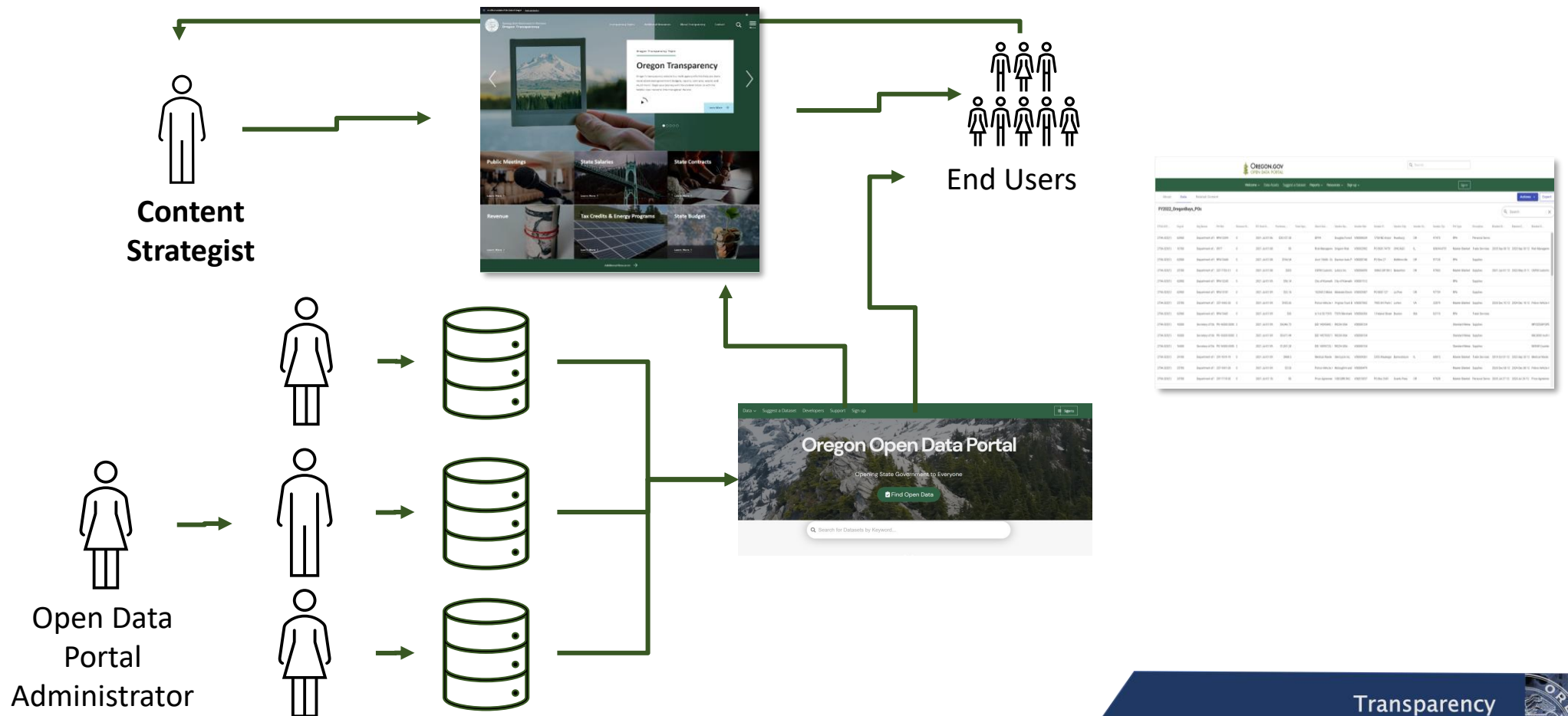
Open Data Portal

data.oregon.gov

- Business, Administrative, Education, Health & Human services, Natural Resources, Public Safety, Recreation, Etc.
- Provides a location for the hosting of datasets, views, calendars on state websites.
- Datasets can be hyperlinked to the state websites; embedded on a page
- Downloadable exported using an ODATA endpoint, or SODA API for use in Excel, Tableau, Power BI, etc.

Legislation - Law

- In 2009, House Bill 2500 launched the Oregon Transparency website and created the Transparency Oregon Advisory Commission (TOAC).
- Updated Legislation 2011-2020
- In 2015, [House Bill 3099](#) transferred from Department of Administrative Services to the State Chief Information Officer: Oversight by Data Governance and Transparency program





The evolution of the Oregon Transparency website is shown through six sequential screenshots:

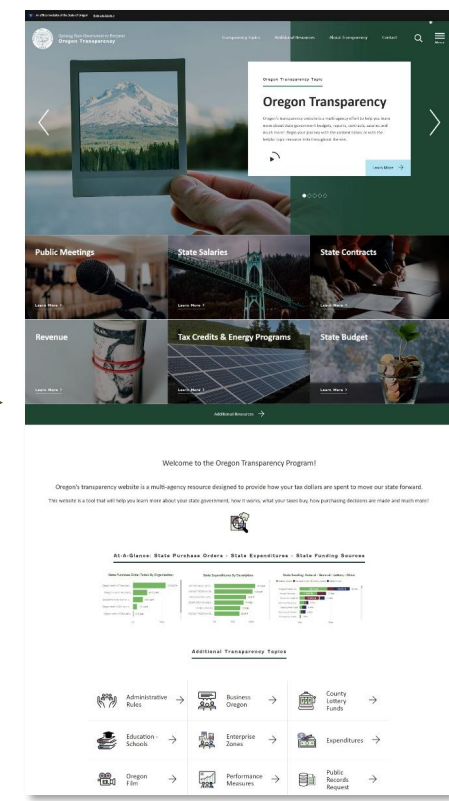
- 2009:** A basic, text-heavy page with a simple layout and limited navigation.
- 2012:** Improved layout with more structured content and a search bar.
- 2014:** Further refined design with a clear navigation menu and more prominent data visualizations.
- 2016:** A more complex interface with multiple columns and detailed data tables.
- 2018:** A modern, clean design with a prominent header, navigation, and categorized content blocks.
- 2020:** A highly user-friendly interface with a large hero image, clear navigation, and a focus on key transparency areas like Public Meetings, State Salaries, and State Contracts.
- 2023:** The most current version, featuring a sleek design, a large hero image, and a comprehensive set of navigation options and data visualizations.

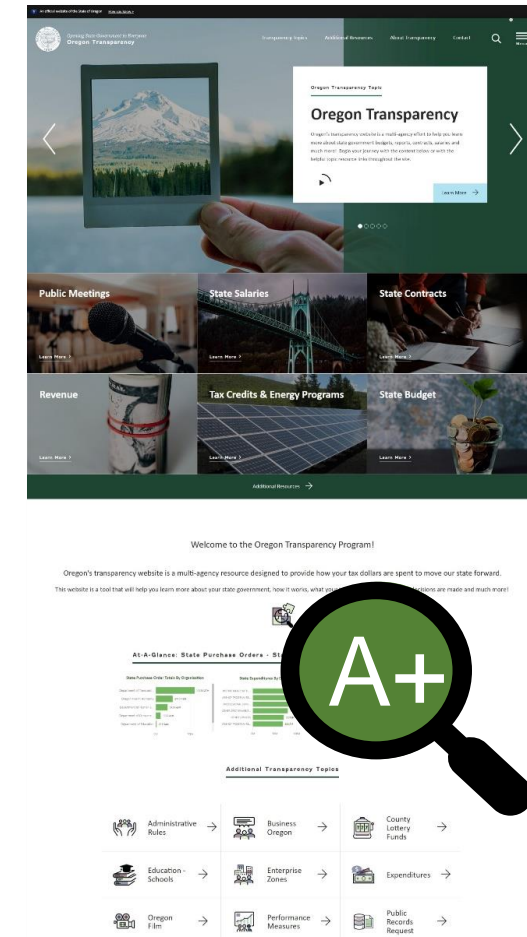

Transparency Oregon Advisory Commission

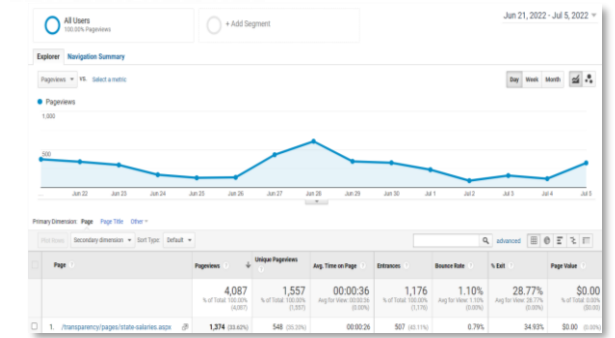
- The **Transparency Oregon Advisory Commission (TOAC)** provides advisement on website content and information.


