

Comprehensive Primary Care Plus Initiative: Call for Provider Participation!

Oregon has been selected by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to be one of 14 regions across the country to implement a national model: Comprehensive Primary Care Plus (CPC+). CPC+ provides a multi-payer model that pays for care differently, which results in improved quality of care, improved patients' health, and smarter use of health care dollars.

The Oregon Health Authority strongly recommends all eligible providers across Oregon apply for this unique opportunity by the September 15, 2016 deadline.

Benefit to providers:

- □ Providers will be paid differently, giving them greater flexibility to deliver comprehensive care patients need.
- Providers will receive:
 - Technical assistance providing proactive, coordinated, population-based care.
 - o Regional and national learning, collaborative, and networking opportunities

<u>Eligibility</u>: Applications are practice-based. Requirements are: At least 150 Medicare beneficiaries are served at the practice; utilization of Certified EHR Technology (CEHRT); existing patient empanelment; provision of 24/7 access for patients; quality improvement activities in place; and, have at least one primary care practitioner, which is defined as a physician (MD or DO), nurse practitioner (NP), physician assistant (PA), or Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS) who has a primary specialty designation of family medicine, internal medicine, or geriatric medicine.
