DURING A WILDFIRE BE READY, BE SET, GO!



Your local law enforcement agency orders evacuations. If you feel threatened by a wildfire, do not wait for an official evacuation order. There are three levels of evacuation:

<p>LEVEL 1 BE READY: Prepare, monitor, and pack your valuables.</p>	<p>LEVEL 2 BE SET: Be set to evacuate at a moment's notice.</p>	<p>LEVEL 3 GO: Leave immediately!</p>
