## NOTICE OF ROAD WORK

# OR HWY. 205 CHIP SEAL (Frenchglen Hwy.)

Beginning June 28 the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) will be chip sealing a portion of OR Highway 205 (Frenchglen Hwy.) in Harney County between mile point 32 and mile point 36. The project will begin at 6:00 a.m. This work is expected to be completed by June 29.

**TRAVEL IMPACTS:** Expect up to 20-minute delays, reduced speeds, loose rock on the roadway, flaggers, and pilot cars directing single lane traffic through the work zones. Also watch for road sweeping operations that will result in minor delays during nighttime/early morning hours for one or two days following the chip seal application. Please slow down and watch for construction activities in the area and plan extra travel time during this highway preservation project. Loose rock on the roadway may be present for several days following the project. Please drive with extra caution and remember traffic fines are double the amount in all work zones.

**REQUEST TO RANCH AND FARMER OWNERS:** ODOT is asking highway users to keep farm equipment off the highway June 28 – 29. To prevent chip rock adhesion problems due to animal waste on the roadway, ranchers are requested to keep cattle and other livestock off the highway June 16 – 30. Animals can be driven on appropriate open range highway sections after the chip seal has been applied.



***NOTE:*** Chip seal work is weather dependent. All dates are subject to change, depending on weather condition.
