## Description

This presentation will present an overview of the opioid overdose epidemic in adolescents. The presenter will focus on evidence-based approaches, from a public health and clinical standpoint, to preventing overdose including harm reduction measures and treatment recommendations.

## Outcome/Objectives

At the end of this presentation, participants will be able to:

1. Analyze recent trends in drug overdose including main drivers of increasing overdose deaths in adolescents in the United States
2. Incorporate evidence-based strategies that decrease the risk of overdose death in patient populations
3. Examine the role of MOUD in adolescents as a treatment tool as well as a way to reduce a patient's risk of overdose.

## About the Presenter



Captain Andrew Terranella is a general pediatrician and medical officer with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Division of Overdose Prevention in the National Center for Injury Prevention and Control. Dr. Terranella is a subject matter expert on overdose prevention and substance use in youth. His research focus is on how health systems and clinicians can better prevent overdose using healthcare setting based primary and secondary interventions. Dr. Terranella is an Assistant Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at the University of Arizona, Tucson and is in clinical practice at El Rio Health in Tucson AZ, where he treats adolescents with substance use disorder and addiction.
