How Your Immediate And Direct Connection Boosts Student Learning

Parents, caregivers and guardians make up a foundational part of our school communities. Learning occurs for students both within and beyond the school walls, and the stronger our connections are with the people closest to our students, the more opportunities we have to deeply know and fully support them.

Helpful Prompts

This year, along with getting to know your students, consider prioritizing connections with parents, caregivers, and guardians at the start of the school year. These prompts for a phone call or meeting can help start the school year off right by building positive connections with the school community:

- **Connect to Their Story:** What is a favorite story about your student, so I can get to know them better?
- **Connect to Their Goals:** What are your goals for your student's education? How would you like to be involved and communicate with me?
- Connect to Their Contribution: How does your student like to contribute? What brings them joy?
