PBOT is scheduled to repave SE Hawthorne Boulevard between SE 24th and 50th Avenues during the summer of 2021 and is looking at ways to take advantage of routine maintenance as an opportunity to improve safety, reduce transit delay, and make other changes to better serve people and businesses on Hawthorne. Our project team developed three possible restriping alternatives based on community feedback and completed a technical evaluation of each option.
