Construction Updates for District 1 – April to June 2025

Exciting progress is being made on infrastructure projects across the District 1 neighborhoods by Pittsburgh Water.

Current Water Main Replacement in Brighton Heights

Water main replacement work in Brighton Heights is ahead of schedule and expected to wrap up by late spring or early summer. Originally anticipated to extend through the summer, most of the infrastructure work is already complete. Paving and concrete work will commence as soon as weather conditions permit. Nearly two miles of new water main was installed and over 100 lead service lines were found and replaced at no cost to the resident. Upon completion, this will be a \$14 million+ investment in the neighborhood.

Upcoming Water Main Replacement Project

Pittsburgh Water will soon award the contract for the next phase of water main replacements in Brighton Heights. This project will focus on streets southwest of the current work area and is set to kick off in June. The anticipated duration is about one year. As part of the project, any lead service lines identified will be replaced at no cost to residents. Standard working hours will be Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., with street closures and detours implemented as needed. Routine Improvements Ramp Up with Warm Weather

Residents can expect other routine projects, like street paving and sidewalk installation, to return as weather improves. While sidewalks and pavement disrupted during water main work will be handled as part of those projects, other one-off repairs that have occurred in the last several months will be handled separately.
