GREAT AMERICANS: SIX HISTORICAL AND LITERARY FIGURES FROM U.S. HISTORY

Winthrop University English & History Professors TUESDAYS, 10 - 11:30 AM

This course, taught as a series by faculty from Winthrop's History and English departments, will explore and examine the lives and contributions of six different Americans worth knowing better. Often in classes, individuals are referenced with a few reasons why they are important to know, but rarely is an entire lesson fully focused on a more complete telling of any one person's life and contributions. In this course, each of the six sessions is taught by a different Winthrop faculty member who will focus the entire session on a single American they have studied more intensely and about whom they are enthusiastic to present. This course will be taught primarily through lectures and presentations.

Recent developments in our city have made it easier and safer to jump on a bicycle and cruise around downtown to get a bite to eat, grab a drink, or just enjoy some fresh air! This class is your opportunity to take a few short, leisurely rides and explore downtown Rock Hill while learning the basic skills you need to plan your own short ride around town. We'll discuss the basic parts and proper fit of bicycles, how to select the right bike, how to confidently identify and travel low-traffic roads, and how to check your bike's ABC's and perform basic maintenance. Cycling helmets and a variety of bike styles will be provided. Students are welcome to use their own bike and helmet during class.

FIRST AID/CPR/AED

Would you know what to do in a cardiac, breathing or first aid emergency? The right answer could help you save a life. This hands-on course will help you recognize and respond appropriately to a variety of life-threatening emergencies. You'll learn the skills you need to give immediate care to a suddenly ill or injured person until more advanced medical personnel arrive and take over. Successful completion of this course could result in a 2-year certification in Adult First Aid, CPR, and AED.

4 week course (February 12 - March 4); \$20; Additional fee: optional \$30 to be certified by the American Red Cross; Class Limit: 20

THEATER FROM GREEKS TO BROADWAY
