GENEALOGY FOR BEGINNERS

John W. Skardon

TUESDAYS, 9:30 AM, October 26 - November 16

4-week course: \$20

Learn how to uncover the fascinating story of your family history with this beginner's class for genealogy. We'll discuss research methods, common sources used by genealogists, and how to organize your discoveries. This in-depth class is designed for beginning researchers or those wanting to better understand the fundamentals of genealogical research. We'll look at how to get started, how to properly interpret and analyze information for evidence, and understanding common sources such as the federal census, newspapers, court records, vital records, and DNA. We'll discuss African-American genealogy research and available print and online resources. Prerequisites: basic computer skills; personal laptop, tablet or smartphone to use in class.

YOUR BASIC BIRD

TUESDAYS, 9 AM, October 26 - November 16

4-week course: \$20

We will explore where birds came from, the ancestral group from which they arose, when it happened, etc. We will then explore how flight and its demands have shaped the features of birds to give them the forms they have today. We'll then consider how birds differ and are similar to mammals such as ourselves. We will look at bird behavior and explore how birds perceive their world. We'll then use the earlier material to understand what you can do to get a yard full of birds. Along the way, Dr. Rogers will use many local examples to get you more familiar with the species you're most likely to encounter in the Rock Hill area.

SHAKESPEARE'S OTHELLO: VICTIM & VILLAIN?

6-week course: \$25 (No class on October 20)

Our study will involve a short discussion of the Elizabethan theater and how Shakespeare not only adapted his plays to its limitations but used the limitations to enhance his works, too. We will discuss Shakespeare's concept of a tragic hero through Othello, an honorable man and respected leader, who murders his innocent wife. How can an honorable man become a murderer? Join us as we investigate! Please do not be intimidated by a Shakespearean play. Remember the uneducated and often drunk "groundlings" in his audience found much to enjoy in the plays. Come join us - it will be fun!

BEGINNER WOODCARVING

This course will introduce students to the basic skills used in wood carving, including tool safety, use of tools, and wood choices. 4-week course: \$20

This interactive course will feature the use of digital resources such as www.rootsandrecall.com, as well as others, in recording and preserving the local history. Students will also discuss York County's roll in national events and explore historic sites across York County using digital resources that help preserve local history and stories. One class session will include a walking tour to explore historic architecture in downtown Rock Hill. Prerequisites: Basic computer skills. Personal laptop, tablet or smartphone to use in class.

WHAT SCHOOLS ARE LIKE TODAY – INSIGHTS, INNOVATIONS, & CONTINUING CHALLENGES

Winthrop Faculty – Richard W. Riley College of Education

THURSDAYS, 9:30 AM, September 23 – October 14

4-week course: \$20

Over the four weeks, individual session topics will include the role of school principals and how they establish school environments that are conducive to teaching and learning; motivating students to learn; the diversity of our schools and what teachers are doing to teach for that diversity; and the Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child (WSCC) approach which connects K-12 students with community resources, including lifelong learners.

HUMAN GENETICS: BEYOND WHAT YOU LEARNED IN HIGH SCHOOL

4-week course: \$20

What are chromosomes? What are DNA and RNA? What are genes? What are the different modes of inheritance? After getting a handle on the principles of genetics, this course will cover human disorders that do not follow these principles. Students will examine the procedures used to identify human disease genes and review research examples. Dr. Schwartz will utilize his experience studying intellectual disability, autism and birth defects to present examples of the complexities of human genetics. Recent studies have revealed that we still have a lot to learn!

YORK COUNTY HISTORY

4-week course: \$20

The course will offer a broad history of York County including: the State Line and how we got the "notch" in our shape; geography of the county; Catawba River; Catawba Indians and Treaties; origin of towns and their names; Great Wagon Road; early churches; Civil War skirmish and Federal Occupation; history of Winthrop University; Hamilton Carhartt, founder of Carhartt Outdoor Clothing, his contributions to Rock Hill and unusual facts about York County. The opportunity for outings to Nation Ford and the foundational remains of the Carhartt Mansion may be available.

ROCK HILL WATER ACADEMY

4-week course: \$20

As a vital source of drinking water, power generation, economic growth and cultural connection for nearly 2 million people, the Catawba River is the lifeblood of our region. In session one you'll hear from Duke Energy about how they manage the river and reservoirs as they partner with local and state governments to provide power, water and recreation in our region. The second session will feature a speaker from the Catawba Riverkeeper as we discuss the conservation and preservation of this vital resource. Finally, in sessions three and four you'll get an in-depth look at drinking water and wastewater treatment and management from the City of Rock Hill water operations team.

An in-depth look at the artist's early years in South Dakota and how those experiences affected his life and his art in California, New York and South Carolina, as described by the author of Vernon Grant's biography.

Participants will learn about Vernon Grant through discussions, visual aids, hands-on experiences and field trips to various locations that feature Vernon Grant works.

October 28: Northside Recreation Center – General discussion about Vernon Grant as told in the book, Beyond Snap! Crackle! Pop!™ The Story of American Illustrator Vernon Grant.

November 4: Louise Pettus Archives – Hands-on experience with many items created by Vernon Grant through the years with Kellogg and the City of Rock Hill, plus a discussion of "Beyond Snap! Crackle! Pop! The Rest of the Story."

November 11: McCelvey Center, York – Review the vast Vernon Grant collection with curator Jillian Matthews.
