




FLAG DAY

In honor of Flag Day VetLinx and Fort Negley Park will hold a special presentation. This year marks the 244th anniversary of the adoption of the United States flag by the Second Continental Congress. We will also celebrate the U.S. Army's 246th birthday on this day!

During the secession crisis in 1861, Captain William Driver's famed *Old Glory*, now preserved by the Smithsonian Institute, waved defiantly above his Nashville residence. Following the occupation of the city by Federal troops in February 1862, *Old Glory* briefly donned the Tennessee State Capitol.
