Greetings City of Dallas Family,

This coming Sunday, June 19, 2022 is Juneteenth National Independence Day, which commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African Americans. This year marks the 157th anniversary of the day that the last African American slaves were freed in Texas in the wake of the Civil War. The name Juneteenth is a combination of the words June and nineteenth and is the oldest known holiday that commemorates the end of slavery in the United States. I encourage you to visit City Hall Lobby to view the official Juneteenth flag that was unveiled by City Council on Wednesday June 15. The Juneteenth flag will also fly at other City facilities for the remained of June. As part of the FY 2022 adopted budget, the City added Monday, June 20 as a paid holiday to observe Juneteenth National Independence Day.

In partnership with the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS), the City held the first naturalization ceremony in recent decades on Tuesday, June 14 in the City Hall Flag Room. Thirty Dallas residents from fifteen different countries were sworn in as United States citizens. This ceremony is part of events happening throughout the month to celebrate Immigrant Heritage Month.
