



Notice of Determination for a Bonded Title or Tax Assessor-Collector Hearing

Information

This form has been issued because the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles determined this vehicle is eligible for a Texas title, but the applicant is unable to provide a valid ownership document.

You may pursue one of the following options and file a completed application for title with your local county tax assessor-collector's office in order to obtain a Texas Certificate of Title:

1. You may file a surety bond with the department.

If you select this option, you (the applicant) and a person authorized to conduct surety business in Texas must execute a surety bond for the amount listed in the "Determination Information" section within one year of obtaining this form. You can locate a licensed surety business on the Texas Department of Insurance's website at <https://www.tdi.texas.gov>.

After obtaining a surety bond, you must file an application for title with your local county tax assessor-collector's office within 30 days of the effective date of the surety bond. The required documents for an application for title are listed on Page 2 of the *Bonded Title Application or Tax Collector Hearing Statement of Fact* (Form VTR-130-SOF) in the "Part 2: Filing an Application for Texas Title and/or Registration" section.

Note: If you select this option, this form is valid for one year from the date of issuance listed below in the "Determination Information" section. If this form is lost or expires, a replacement or new form requires payment of the \$15.00 fee.

2. You may request a hearing with your local county tax assessor-collector.

If you select this option, this form and all supporting documents must be presented to your local county tax assessor-collector's office along with a request for a county tax assessor-collector's hearing. The county assessor-collector will determine whether the department correctly refused to issue or correctly rescinded, canceled, revoked, or suspended the title. If the county tax assessor-collector denies your appeal, you may appeal their decision to a county or district court.

Note: As part of this process, the department notifies any interested parties, such as the current owners or lienholders on the department's motor vehicle record, that this process has been initiated. If any identified party claims an interest in the motor vehicle, a county or district court order will be required to stop the transfer of title under this process.
