

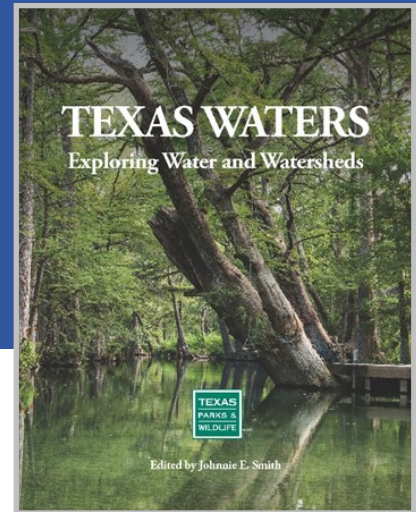

Certification Requirements

Obtain at least 8 hours of Advanced Training from a *combination* of the following:

- Watch Texas Waters webinars - live or recorded
- Read Texas Waters curriculum and pass quizzes
- Attend Texas Waters Day and aquatic sessions at the Master Naturalist Annual Meeting
- Other partner agency aquatic or watershed learning activities or trainings

New Specialists earn a Certificate and heron pin!

Annual Renewal Requirements

- Participate in at least 10 hours of volunteer service in the area of aquatic conservation, ecology, education, or stewardship

Examples: Habitat restoration, water quality monitoring, storm drain marking, clean-ups, and educational programs & events.
